Annual Training Requirements

I. <u>Provider/License Holder & 2nd Adult Caregivers (used 30+ days in a 12-month period)</u> - 16 hours per licensing year and must include:

<u>Child Development and Learning & Behavior Guidance</u> (every licensing year)

*Must be a DHS approved class = **Knowledge & Competency Framework (KCF) I or Knowledge and Competency Framework (KCF) II.C** (as rated Minnesota Center for Professional Development on www.developtoolmn.org)

<u>Active Supervision</u> (2 hours every licensing year) - Must be a DHS approved class

Options: There are several Active Supervision classes available (2 hrs.)

• Training must be completed in person, face-to-face, in a classroom, or online at least once every two years.

<u>Health and Safety I</u> This class must be completed by 12/31/2022 and then every 5 years thereafter.

* This class can be counted for the annual active supervision training requirement in the year completed.

Health and Safety II This class must be completed by 12/31/2022 and then every 5 years thereafter.

* This class can be counted for the annual active supervision training requirement in the year completed.

NOTE: Child Restraint Systems (Car Seat) training must be completed every 5 years if transporting children under the age of nine.

II. Substitutes (from 31 hours to 30 days in a 12-month period)

CPR (every 2 years) – Must include techniques for infants and children

<u>First Aid</u> (every 2 years)

Sudden Unexpected Infant Death (SUID) & Abusive Head Trauma (AHT)

- *Training must be completed in person, face-to-face, in a classroom, or on-line at least once every two years.
- * On the years when the above training is not required, the license holder must receive SUID and AHT training through viewing six videos. The videos must be approved by the Minnesota Department of Human Services.

III. Substitutes (30 hours or less in a 12-month period)

Sudden Unexpected Infant Death (SUID) & Abusive Head Trauma (AHT)

- * Training must be completed in person, face-to-face, in a classroom, or on-line at least once every two years.
- * On the years when the above training is not required, the license holder must receive SUID and AHT training through viewing six videos. The videos must be approved by the Minnesota Department of Human Services.

IV. Helpers (ages 13-17)

Sudden Unexpected Infant Death (SUID) & Abusive Head Trauma (AHT)

- * Training must be completed in person, face-to-face, in a classroom, or on-line at least once every two years.
- * On the years when the above training is not required, the license holder must receive SUID and AHT training through viewing six videos. The videos must be approved by the Minnesota Department of Human Services.

Helpers who assist with care on a regular basis (at least monthly) must complete 6 hours of training within one year after the date of initial employment.
